NORM AMUNDSONHope-Centered Career Development

In this presentation, Dr Amundson will put forward a new career development model with the dimension of "hope" as the centre point. He also will share some CERIC-funded research that explores the relationship between hope and student engagement, academic performance and vocational identity. The research also investigated how some people were able to remain hopeful even when facing some very challenging situations. As part of the presentation, Dr Amundson will also demonstrate some practical interventions that are designed to support and enhance a sense of hopefulness about the future.

Norm is a Full Professor in Counselling Psychology with the Faculty of Education at The University of British Columbia. He has given numerous workshops and seminars and has been a keynote speaker at many national and international conferences. In his writings, Dr Amundson emphasizes the importance of creativity, imagination, cultural awareness and action as career development strategies. His publications include over 70 journal articles; training DVDs; books and several career workbooks.

Dr Amundson has won a number of awards and as a consultant, he has developed a number of training materials for the Canadian Federal Government. These materials have received national and international acclaim and have been used as a foundation for training in many different countries

ROBERTA NEAULTUnpacking "Assessment" - It's Bigger Than You Think!

Career development practitioners, counsellors and HR professionals often request training or consultation about assessment but, drilling down, the term means different things to different people. Effective assessment is a comprehensive process and begins with strategic planning about structuring your approach. Clarifying client needs is essential before selecting assessment tools or making informed referral decisions, accessing appropriate funding, and/or choosing an assessor. Regardless of whether you're conducting the assessment process yourself or guiding the approach as a case manager, it's important to holistically integrate assessment results from multiple sources. There's also an art to writing, and interpreting, assessment reports. Whether your goal is to add to your assessment toolkit, acquire more specialized assessment competencies, or simply gain a better understanding of assessment options for your clients, this presentation will enhance your understanding of the complexities of "assessment" within the career development sector.

Roberta is Associate Dean of the Master of Arts in Counselling Psychology program at Yorkville University and President of Life Strategies Ltd., and is an award-winning career management specialist with over three decades of relevant experience in counselling, coaching, consulting, training, curriculum design, research and writing. She has taught masters-level assessment courses for several universities and co-led a comprehensive mapping project for the Forum of Labour Market Ministers on the use of assessment tools, models and processes within career/employment services across Canada. She is the recipient of the BC Career Development Association's Mentor of the Year Award, the National Employment Counseling Association's Professional Development Award, the Canadian Career Development Foundation's Stu Conger Award for Leadership in Career Counselling and Career Development in Canada, the Gold Medal and the Diamond Pin for Leadership in Career Development.
